Mark Struckhoff

Beginning in August, the Reverend Mark Struckhoff took the reins as our new Director of the Clergy and Church Financial Ministry (C2FM). Mark took over from founding director, Chris Bouchard. Chris will remain in a supporting role as the Associate Director of C2FM.

Mark recently retired from serving as the Executive Director of the Council of Churches of the Ozarks, where he served since 2007. In partnership with more than 70 churches from 17 different traditions throughout the Ozarks, Mark guided the Council of Churches in delivering direct human services to the region's most vulnerable people. Originally from St. Louis, a graduate of Perkins School of Theology at Southern Methodist University, and an ordained United Methodist pastor, Mark brings 30 years of experience serving local congregations and leading non-profit organizations in Missouri and Texas.



Mark's collaborative work with pastors coupled with his own ministry experience gives him a keen understanding of the unique situations that arise in the lives of pastors and congregations. "I look forward to connecting with clergy and helping them live into all God has called them to be," states Mark, "and I am grateful for all the terrific programming that Chris and the Foundation staff have already developed."

The Grace of Giving

With the economic crisis impacting so many communities, consider offering a 9-week, online Financial Peace University (FPU) class through your church. FPU is a proven approach to helping people become and live debt-free, buy smart, save for the future, and much more. Your class can be offered community-wide to reach folks beyond the church. Your church's contact, prayers, and connection to people

struggling through economic hardship can bring life-altering change in your community on many levels. **Bonus:** The Foundation's C2FM program will pay the \$189 start-up cost for your church, pay the \$129 fee for any pastor and staff person (.5 FTE) to attend, and offer counsel on how to market the class and engage participants in online learning.
